Autumn 2 Term Subject Overview



English	<p>In English this term we be continuing to work through an Anthology about the Origins of Language.</p> <p>We will also carry on studying Stig of the Dump. We will be reading the novel alongside developing our grammar, spelling and creative writing skills. Students will participate in one lesson of Reading Plus per week to support student's progress in reading.</p>
Maths	<p>We will be studying measure. As a class we will be looking at length, distance, capacity and mass.</p> <p>We will study how the units of measurement are used and will learn the vocabulary of metric measure.</p> <p>They will also look at time, including seconds, minutes, hours, days, weeks, months and years. Students will look at money and finances in context, beginning to understand budgeting.</p>
Science	<p>This half term we will be completing a metals unit and then progressing to electricity and energy. We will be exploring electrical circuits, energy transfer and energy resources.</p>
PSHE	<p>We will continue to look at relationships and how we can maintain safe and positive relationships. We will look at keeping safe online and whilst in school. We also looked at different types of bullying, with a big focus on cyber bullying and again, staying safe online. We will also look at and discuss at what point does 'banter' become bullying'. We will also look at being able to manage our feelings, identifying possible dangerous relationships and scenarios that may put us at risk of harm or vulnerability e.g. stranger danger, talking to people online, are they who they say they are?</p>
Citizenship	<p>We will continue to consider what it means to live in a free country and exploring the concept of democracy.</p>
PE and PE Theory	<p>Practical- Tchoukball and personal fitness.</p> <p>Theory- We will still be looking at healthy lifestyle and wellbeing for their theory element. We will look at healthy eating, how we can get more exercise and what happens if we don't do enough exercise.</p>
Art	<p>This half term will be drawing animal shapes adapted to their best interests and using different art media and techniques. We</p>

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	<p>will start exploring drawings using one perspective point. We will also be celebrating the Remembrance Day by creating poppies and doing a mural. We will be exploring other cultures with the day of the death and Mexican Art Frida Kahlo, and Christmas crafts like lanterns and other adornments.</p>
DT	<p>We will be starting a Focused Practical Task this half term</p> <p>They will conduct some research into British garden birds and plan/make their own bird feeders.</p> <p>They will also continue to build their confidence using paper and card models to create pop-up greetings cards</p>
History	<p>We shall be looking the development of medieval England and Wales. We shall be looking at how England changed over the medieval period following the Norman Conquest, we shall also look at how England and Wales were unified as one country.</p>
Geography	<p>We will explore how we use our planet as a natural resource. We will learn the different elements that make up our planet and how they interact. They will define renewable and non-renewable resources used by humans.</p>
Computing	<p>Pupils have completed the first module, <i>Collaborating Online Respectfully</i>. Two of the four pupils took the Summative Assessment and demonstrated their learning. After half term, we move on to <i>Networks: from semaphores to the internet</i>.</p> <p>This unit begins by defining a network and addressing the benefits of networking, before covering how data is transmitted across networks using protocols. The types of hardware required are explained, as is wired and wireless data transmission. Learners will develop an understanding of the 'internet' and 'World Wide Web', and of the key services and protocols used. Practical exercises are included throughout to help strengthen understanding.</p>
