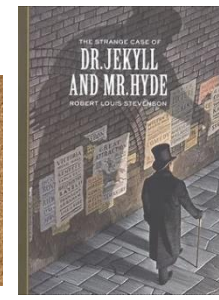


# Shakespeare Class Autumn 1 2023

<p>Students have been completing their jobs list on the care farm.</p> <p>Replacing feed and water for the goats, chickens, guinea pigs, rabbits, and gerbils.</p> <p>Students have collected eggs from the chicken enclosures.</p> <p>Once they have been completing their jobs on the list, they have enjoyed tending to the baby rabbits on the care farm.</p>	<p>This half term the learners will be looking at the Homeric Hymns, including the Hymn to Demeter and Heracles.</p> <p>They will be looking at examples of Greek Temples such as the Temple of Zeus at Olympia and the Parthenon in Athens.</p> <p>The half term will finish with an investigation into how Octavian became Augustus, the first Roman Emperor.</p>	<p>Students are looking at urban issues and challenges.</p> <p>They will discuss the growing percentage of people living in urban areas.</p> <p>They will look at how urban growth creates challenges as well as opportunities, including social, economic, and environmental.</p> <p>They will also learn about how urban sustainability requires management of resources and transport.</p>	<p>This half term the learners are looking at research techniques in psychology. They will look at experiment design, sampling, ethics of research, interviews, questionnaires, case studies and reliability.</p> <p>The learners will also be considering mental health, the effects of mental health and the biological and psychological explanations for depression.</p>

<p style="text-align: center;"><b>DofE</b></p> <p>Students will be completing Silver D of E, including developing knowledge about Navigation, compass use, campcraft, meal planning and first Aid.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Art</b></p> <p>During Autumn 1, the Art students will be working on their Identity project by exploring different perceptions about identity using portraits and different techniques. They will research artists who worked on this theme and create some original pieces.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Science</b></p> <p>Students will learn how genetic information is passed down from one generation to another, the diversity of organisms, living and extinct as the result of evolution. In physics, they will be learning what all the material in the universe is made of (very small particles) Moving onto revision of reactivity of metals.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;"><b>PE</b></p> <p>In practical lessons, the class will be studying both football and tchoukball. They will learn the rules of each game, different skills such as shooting, passing, and defending/ marking. The class will be developing these skills in preparation for the Autumn games at the end of the term.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Maths</b></p> <p>This half term we will be covering the GCSE curriculum with all students in Shakespeare. Starting with number we will review types of numbers and number skills including identifying prime and square numbers, finding factors and multiples, calculating with negative numbers, finding the highest common factor and lowest common multiple of a pair of numbers and prime factors. Next we will move on to fractions, decimals and percentages, multiplying and dividing fractions and calculator skills, increasing and decreasing a percentage by an amount and relating it to real life by calculating tax and discussing money. In this half term we will also cover statistics unit about scatter diagrams and different statistical representations.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><b>RS and RE GCSE Option</b></p> <p>The learners will consider the role of religion in family life and relationships with a focus on Christianity and Hinduism. The learners will also consider the beliefs of Hindus looking at Brahman, Atman, the Trimurti and Avatars.</p>
