Lawrence Class Autumn 2 2023



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Students will be learning about the history of flight.

Students will describe the first flight in a balloon, outline who the wright brothers were and what they built and describe the first powered flight and when it happened.

Geography

Students will continue work on English landmarks. Students will learn about the 7 continents and where these are located on a map.

RE

Students will learn about the Nativity story and Christmas traditions around the world.

Science

Students will be continuing to be learn about forces and magnets. Students will understand that magnetic forces can act at a distance, observe how magnets attract or repel each other and attract some materials and not others, and predict whether two magnets will attract or repel each other, depending on which poles are facing. Students will start to explore electricity, and electrical circuits.

Maths

- Students will look at number bonds to and within 10 in detail.
- Students will use formal written methods of addition of numbers with up to three digits.
- Students will deal with 4-digit numbers and add and subtract multiples of 1,000.

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English

- Listening and answer comprehension questions linked to the book.
- Watching films linked with the theme
- Writing using colourful semantics
- Reading
- Discussing and explaining related to theme

Animal Care

Students will complete a range of husbandry tasks to promote and maintain the health and wellbeing of a range of small mammals and farm livestock animals. Students will prepare and deliver food and water to rabbits, guinea pigs, gerbils, goats, sheep, and poultry. Students will spot/strip clean animal accommodation and check it is safe and secure. Students will complete visual and physically health checks.

Forest School

Students will complete a variety of tasks in the forest school such as crafts and cooking. Students will learn specific skills such as tying knots, building dens and whittling.

PSHE

Students will learn about cultural differences and how they can cause conflict. Students will explore different types of bullying including racism, rumours, and name-calling and discuss how we can enjoy and respect other cultures.
