Zephaniah Class Spring 1 2023



Life skills

Students will continue to explore how to manage and run their own home. Looking at how to complete daily household tasks, such as cooking, cleaning. They will be gaining an understanding of how to carry out these tasks safely, how often they need to be completed and how accidents can be avoided in the home and workplace. They will also take a basic first aid course.

Managing Money Maths

Students will find out about the national min. wage and explore how to mange a budget to live within the national min. wage.

GCSE.

This half term in Zephaniah we will focus on shape, number and fractions and percentages. They will review 2D shapes, finding areas and perimeters, missing sides, and enlargement. They will learn about factors, multiples, prime, square and cube numbers, and apply their number skills to fractions, decimals, and percentages.

FUNCTIONAL SKILLS

As a class they will be completing work on all aspects of Geometry. In that they will understand how to calculate angles, Lines of symmetry, and to interpret plans and nets shapes. They will be re-examining angles and how to calculate them. They will also be familiarizing themselves with their functional skills papers in preparation for their exams.

TITAN travel

Year 1 Students will start to explore how to travel using public transport and look at how to read timetables.

Year 2 students will explore independent travel to unfamiliar areas and how to read maps.

English

GCSE

This half term Zephaniah will focus on English Language Paper 2. They will also revisit Assessment Outcomes AO1-AO5 to help them prepare for Mock exams later in the half term.

Functional Skills

Science

This term, GCSE science taking students in this class, will be exploring inheritance, variation and evolution with the big idea linked to these topics being: genetic information is passed down from one generation of organisms to another. The topics being explored will be:

- · Sexual and Asexual reproduction Recap
- · DNA structure
- ·DNA and the genome (chromosomes and genes)
- ·Sex determination in humans
- · Genetic inheritance (single gene)
- · Genotype and Phenotype
- · Inherited disorders

Another theme, they will be exploring will be variation and evolution with the associated big idea being, the diversity of organisms, living and extinct, is the result of evolution. **Topics** · Mutations ·Theory of evolution · Evolution through Natural selection ·Speciation · Evidence for evolution · Identification and classification of living things ·Fossils · Extinction · Resistant bacteria

Work experience

Students will be attending their chosen work placements. Learning skills such as time keeping and resilience.

They will be reviewing and documenting their progress through their work placement diaries.

Students will review key skills learnt from last term and state how they can improve on these. They will also link these skills to other areas of employment.

ART

The students will produce an illustrated study of the life and work of an artist. Create a product for a display. Keep a journal and create a portfolio. Curate an exhibition of artwork and visit the exhibition—interview with a local professional.

They will also be working towards arts and traditions of different special days/celebrations: Mardi Gras and the Holi festival.

Business Studies

Zephaniah will look at a range of external influences that can affect the way businesses operate.
