PSHE

PE

GCSE students will continue working towards their IGCSE in PE. They will continue to study the psychology of sport and begin to look at the role of the media and sponsorship. They will also be working towards his practical assessment for his coursework in a variety of sports.

Art

During this half-term, students will be developing an Art challenge based on their chosen artist. It can be made using different art forms and presented using various media. They will also visit an exhibit and write a review.

English

This term Lee will be working on how to read a variety of texts. Lee are delving into the process of how to read and answer questions in depth. This will lead to practising exam papers in Functional Skills.

Science

Lee will continue working towards a biology only GCSE qualification and will complete topics on evolution as well as infection and control with focus on plants. Lesson will include Mutations, Theory of evolution, Evolution through Natural selection, Speciation, Evidence for evolution, Identification and classification of living things, Fossils, Extinction, Resistant bacteria plant disease, Plant diseases and Plant defence responses

Computer Science

Lee are continuing the current programming unit which takes learners from being complete novices to having the confidence to tackle any GCSE-level programming challenge. Essential programming theory is also interleaved into the practical elements of programming to provide tangible links between required knowledge and skills.

Citizenship

In the next half term, we will be working on the following questions, Why do we use money? What do you do with your money? What is the best way to pay for things? What is borrowing money? How can I keep control of my money? Are you a saver or a spender? Being a clever customer? And finally internet shopping and safety.

Employability

Lee class continue to focus on interview skills- practising a digital Mock interview. They will also be developing a CV and focusing on post 16 applications. The class are participating in a series of virtual work experiences and desk tasks- to develop

PDP

Lee class will be learning about subjects entailing foreign foods, foreign travel and managing personal finances.

In foreign foods, students will be creating a case study of a singular country and their culture of food and beverages.

In foreign travel, students will be learning about how to book a holiday, hotel and how to arrange an itinerary to explore their chosen country.

In managing personal finances, students will be learning about how to decipher a wage slip and what their money can go towards, such as tax and national insurance.

Animal Care

Student will work towards a Vocational Award. This is a combination of Animal Care and Horticulture. We are working on their confidence with smaller animals and handling them. We will also health check, muck out and develop better accommodation.

They are also working on the Sixth form garden with input from Mark our horticulture Teacher, to grow crops and develop his horticultural skills.

Maths
