Sissay Class Summer 1 2024



History

The learners will be examining the Stuart period in English History. They will begin by considering he tragic story of Mary Queen of Scots, the union of the crowns under James I, the causes of the Civil War and how Parliament won.

RE

The learners will be looking at Christianity and Christian beliefs. This includes examining the Trinity, Miracles, the resurrection and the idea of salvation. We will look at this in the context of how it affects the lives of Christians today.

PE

Sissay will be participating in tennis this term. They will be developing skills such as different grips, playing different areas of the court and different tactics. They will learn to play both cooperatively and competitively in singles and doubles tennis matches as well as learning the rules for each game. Towards the end of the term, Sissay will begin to develop skills in the game of rounders, focusing on the different roles within the game; striking, fielding and bowling.

Science

Pupils will start the term completing physics topics focused on the following big ideas:

Big Idea 1:

Current carrying conductors can exert force on each other.

Chemistry topics will be based on reactions
Big Idea: During chemical reactions, atoms are
rearranged and new substances are formed.

- Acids and alkalis
- Chemical energy
- Types of reaction

Geography

Sissay will complete their 'How do we adapt for the world's biomes? 'Unit, before moving on to 'What is weather and climate?' They will study the concepts of weather and climate and the elements that make them up. Learn how to measure weather and read weather map.

Maths

Sissay will be continuing their look into statistics, learning how to read and interpret pie charts, bar graphs and developing problem solving skills, as well as having the opportunity to create their own research and graph project. Later in the half term we will be doing an introduction to algebra, where the students will start to familiarise themselves with unknown values in their maths work, and how to use function machines, developing this skill on to algebraic expressions and solving simple algebraic equations.

English

This half term in English we are studying Oliver Twist, looking at life in Victorian England and the differences between the rich and poor during this era. We will also be having a class trip to Gressenhall Farm and Workhouse to give Sissay pupils a hands-on experience of how life was for many people during the Victorian period.

PSHE
