<p><u>English</u></p> <p><u>Theme: Non-Fiction</u> Features of a non-fiction text, such as: title, sub-title, index and glossary. Forming lower case and upper-case letters correctly. Using commas, capital letters and full stops in our sentences. Learning about adjectives, verbs, and nouns. Colourful semantics. Daily Phonics.</p>	<p><u>Mathematics</u></p> <p>In maths this half term we are covering the rest of our measurement topic, learning about volume and capacity. Following this we are going to begin working on sharing equally and writing fractions. We are also going to do some work on reading the time to the hour and half an hour.</p>	<p><u>Geography</u></p> <p>Learning more about our local area of Norfolk, looking at beaches, woodland and farmland that we have around our school.</p>

We will be thinking scientifically about the world around us and begin to make hypotheses and questions about our surroundings.</p>

We will be looking at life cycles, what our bodies looks like, how we change.</p>	<p><u>Music</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> · Explore different percussion instruments during choice time · Improve the rhythm skills playing different music games · Listening and explore new music instruments · Create music improvisation with peers · Share music ideas and opinions with peers · Share fun and music preferences with others. 	<p><u>History</u></p> <p>We are continuing on with our theme of the Olympics, looking at how the Olympics are different now to in ancient Greece.</p>
		<p><u>Computing</u></p> <p>Using a search engine. How to make a presentation. Internet safety.</p>

<p><u>PE</u></p> <p>Fletcher class will be taking part in Athletics this term. They will be developing different areas of track and field including running, jumping, and throwing. In running they will be developing their ability to perform short duration and low intensity runs. They should also begin to understand how to start a race from a standing position, running in a straight line. In jumping they will be developing their ability to engage in simple jumping activities, focusing on two footed jumps over small obstacles. In throwing, they will be introduced to the fundamentals of throwing overarm and underarm using lightweight objects such as soft balls/bean bags. They will begin to develop throwing from a distance, focusing on their aim and accuracy. Fletcher class will have an introduction to relays, they will begin to participate in simple relay activities that involve running and passing a baton in a team setting. They will develop their agility through activities that require quick changes of direction and challenges that involve coordination and multiple movements.</p>	<p><u>Home Learning Ideas</u></p> <p>Telling the time together on different types of clock, pointing out the time to encourage your child to begin to read a clock independently.</p> <p>Talk about independence and starting to have ownership of small responsibilities around the house.</p> <p>Talk about Zones of Regulation and own feelings.</p> <p>Talk about friends and being kind.</p> <p>Talk about why it is important to keep everyone safe.</p> <p>Share poems and stories of all different types.</p> <p>Encourage reading of signs and symbols in the environment.</p>
