#### <u>Literacy</u>

- Daily Phonics.
- Recognises their name when spoken, begins to recognise written name.
- Show enjoyment in sharing a book
- Mark makes meaningfully and begins to form recognisable letters.
- Enjoys the sensory experience of mark making.

# Communication and Language

- Communicate my wants and needs successfully
- Use sounds within my play.
- Use sounds to show how I am feeling.

# Physical Development

- Feed self.
- Learn how to use a knife, fork and spoon.
- Dress and undress with greater independence.
- Develop my posture and stability.
- Use my core muscles, cross my midline, develop my hand and eye coordination.

### <u>Personal, Social and</u> Emotional Development

- Zones of Regulation daily.
- I can show my likes and dislikes as well as my wants and needs.
- I can start to understand body part names such as finding my eyes.
- I show enjoyment in seeing myself in the mirror.

#### **Understanding the World**

- Recognise familiar people in photos.
- Enjoy stories about nature and the world around them.
- Start to see that people have similarities and difference from myself.
- Begins to have friends.
- Enjoys joining in routines.

### **Expressive Arts and Design**

- Can engage in creative play.
- Can use my imagination in play such as pretending one thing is another.
- Can start to show that I find things funny.
- I can use instruments to make noise.
- Can use nature to create.
- Create sound effects and movements.
- Create movements and sounds to stories.

## **Acorn Activities**

- Explore different sounds.
- Develop motor skills of playing and holding instruments.
- Follow simple instructions.
- Turn taking, waiting and communication
- Explore life cycles.
- Changes in animals in colder months.
- Support in building the sensory garden
- Changes in nature.

#### **Home Learning Ideas**

- Listen to an adult read a range of books and encourage finger following of words.
- Encourage recognising letter sounds and copying/ tracing.
- Provide mark making opportunities using a range of media including pencils, crayons and felt tips.
- Fine motor activities which develop hand strength such as playdoh, popping bubble wrap, tweezers and scissors.
- Counting everyday objects up to 20.
- Oral blending games such as Simon says (touch your h-ea-d).
- Create opportunities to practice waiting for wants to be met or showing needs/ wants through gestures or words.
- Play turn taking/ sharing games.
- Encourage participation in phone calls/ face time to practise interaction skills.
- Give opportunities to experience being proud.
- Support following routines, such as eating, then tidying rubbish.
- Promote independence where possible, such as putting on shoes or zipping up coat.
